REMARKS***** Asset Forfeiture *****

On 1/9/17 at approximately 2054 hours I responded to the rear parking lot of Forest City Wines and Spirits for a report of a motor vehicle accident. The anonymous caller reported a white vehicle, which had collided into a parked car, was attempting to leave the scene. Officer Ward also responded.

Officer Ward pulled into the parking lot via the east driveway. I pulled into the west driveway. I pulled all the way to the south in the parking lot and observed a white BMW 330i bearing CT reg 3ARGA8. The driver side of the vehicle was jammed up against a tan Toyota Camry. The vehicle was running and two black male occupants were in the vehicle. One male later identified as Dejevon Green, was sitting in the backseat of the vehicle on the passenger side. The second male was identified . . . , was sitting in the front passenger seat. I pulled directly behind the vehicle and exited my marked Police cruiser. When the occupants saw Officer Ward, I observed both parties moving in a downward motion around in the vehicle. It appeared to me that the parties were attempting to reach for a weapon or hide contraband. Both parties opened the passenger side doors and attempted to exit the vehicle. I told the parties to stay in the vehicle. Both parties hesitated to go back in the vehicle. I told them again to get back in the vehicle, which they did. As I was speaking with both parties I could detect a strong odor which I recognize from my training and experiences to be marijuana. I asked who the driver of the vehicle was. Green stated "I was" and stated the vehicle belonged to him.

Officer Ward and I asked the parties to step out of the vehicle, which they did. Officer Ward was speaking with [redacted] and I spoke with Green. I advised Green that due to the strong odor of marijuana Police would be searching his vehicle. Green became very uneasy when I advised him the search would be taking place.

Officer Terribile arrived to the location. Officer Terribile advised me that the BMW was a vehicle that was in a music video that was posted to Facebook on 9/25/16 by Green. In the video Green is rapping. In the video multiple known Middletown area blood gang members are brandishing firearms and flashing gang signs.

Officer Schriener arrived on scene with his K-9 Partner Otto and began the search of the vehicle. As Officer Schriener was searching the vehicle, Green would not take his eyes off the vehicle and appeared to be extremely nervous.

Officer Schriener advised me he located a loaded firearm, wrapped in a ski mask under the driver seat of the vehicle.

Green does not have a pistol permit.

At that point Green was placed in handcuffs. I placed Green in the backseat of my cruiser.

I put gloves on and made the firearm safe. The firearm was a silver 5 shot Interarms .38special revolver, which was fully loaded. I placed the firearm in a paper evidence bag and secured it in the trunk of my vehicle.

Officer Schriener continued to search the vehicle. During the search Officer Schriener found a plastic bag which contained 13 smaller bags filled with marijuana in the driver side door pocket the weight of the marijuana in the door pocket was 12.4grams. Also in the driver side door pocket was a small bag of marijuana which weighed 6.4grams. In the passenger side door pocket was a large bag of marijuana which weighed 22.4grams. A small bag of marijuana was found in a Tupperware container in a black shoebox which was located in the back seat, the marijuana in the shoebox weighed 4.4grams. Also found in the shoebox was a digital scale. There were hundreds of unused sealable plastic bags in the shoebox as well. I know through my training and experiences that drug dealers use scales to break up larger amounts of marijuana in to smaller quantities. Drug dealers then use the small sealable plastic bags to package the marijuana for sale. In the trunk of the vehicle a shiny blue backpack was located, in the backpack a small sealable bag was located with an unknown white powder. A total of 3 black ski masks were located in the vehicle, 1 under the seat, which the firearm was wrapped in and 2 in the glove compartment. I know ski masks to be used to commit crimes such as robberies.

The total weight of the marijuana was 45.7grams or 1.61 ounces. The marijuana was high grade marijuana. If sold at \$20 per gram the total street value of the marijuana would be \$914. The amount of marijuana in Green's possession was more than what a common user would have. This quantity is more indicative of a person involved with sales. The marijuana, the scale and packaging materials, and the weapon used to protect Green's product and monetary gains; it is evident that Green is directly involved in the sale and trafficking of marijuana.

The U.S. currency was deemed to be ill-gotten gains of illicit drug sales and was seized under asset forfeiture. The BMW was seized in-rem.

Detective Peck advised Green of his rights on scene and Green stated he would waive his rights and provide a sworn written statement on a Middletown Police Rights Waiver form. Green stated on Monday 1/9/17 he drove to Middletown to pick up his friend [redacted]. As Green was backing out when his vehicle got stuck. He stated the Police showed up. Green stated anything Police found in the vehicle belongs to him. Green stated the "gun under the seat is mine". Green stated the gun is a .38 special. Green stated he got it from a girl. Green stated "any weed in the vehicle belongs to me". Green stated he did not think there was any cocaine or crack in the vehicle. Green stated a shiny blue backpack found in the trunk was not his. He stated he did not know where the backpack came from and that he never saw it before Police showed it to him.

NOTE: The location that Green was in possession of the firearm and marijuana was 145.03ft from the Green Street Art Center, which is an educational facility for elementary aged children.

At Middletown Police Headquarters Detective Dirga weighed all of the marijuana using a department scale. Detective Dirga

tested the marijuana using a NARK8 test kit, which tests for the presence on THC/Marijuana. The test revealed a blue/purple color which is indicative of the presence of marijuana. The white powder did not test positive for an illicit substance.

Detective Peck tagged all of the items as evidence and I placed them in MPD evidence locker #13.

Green was charged with 21a-279(a)(1) Possession of a controlled substance, 21a-277(b) Possession of marijuana with intent to sell, 21a-278(a)(b) Possession of Marijuana with intent to sell within 1500 feet of a school/daycare, 29-38 Weapon in a motor vehicle, 29-35 Carrying a handgun without a pistol permit on UAR# 8873870. He was issued a court date of 1/10/17 at GA09 and held on a \$150,000 surety bond.
