REMARKS

On 12/14/2016, at approximately 2223 hours I, Officer Foster, conducted a motor vehicle stop on Route 66 (Washington Street) for a vehicle that was failing to maintain its proper lane along with other motor vehicle violations. The operator was identified as Ashley Labonte by her Connecticut Driver's License. During the course of my interaction with the accused, and the events leading up to the vehicle stop, I determined that the operator was possibly under the influence of drugs and or alcohol. I requested that the operator exit the vehicle and submit to a standardized field sobriety test. The accused stated she would consent to a SFST.

After the tests were demonstrated and performed, the accused had failed to properly perform the tests to standard.

The sum of all observations from the first contact with Labonte to the time of arrest supported the probable cause for the arrest of D.U.I. Labonte was advised she was under arrest.

It is important to note that I am a graduate of the ARIDE (Advanced Roadside Impairment Driving Enforcement) program which targets detection on drugged driving. Based on my observations, investigation, and training and experience I believe Labonte was under the influence of some sort of stimulant drug.

Labonte was read her Notice of Rights Form at approximately 2254 hours and at 2256 hours she declined console from an attorney.

Results

I am certified in the Drager Alcotest 9510. The device was checked in accordance with the applicable state regulations.


On 12/14/2016, at approximately 2310 hours, the following breath test result was obtained 0.000.

Based on those results, this Officer switched to a urine test at 2325 hours. A urine sample was obtained and was submitted to the state lab for evaluation. The results of the test are to be determined at a later date.

Labonte was charged with violation of C.G.S. 14-227a DUI and violation of C.G.S. 14-236 Failure to Maintain Lane. Labonte was released on a \$500 dollar non-surety bond and is scheduled to appear in Middlesex Superior Court on January 11, 2017 at 0900 hours. Labonte's vehicle was towed from the scene by Midtown Towing.

Details emerged of Cyr meeting and engaging in Prostitution with the complainant through an online website. Cyr was searched on

scene and was found in possession of \$150.00, which was located concealed in her bra. Cyr was also found in possession of drug paraphernalia, which was located in her purse.

Based on the investigation Cyr was charged with C.G.S 53a-82; Prostitution, C.G.S 53a-125b; Larceny 6th, and C.G.S 21a-267(a); Drug Paraphernalia. Cyr was unable to post her \$10,000.00 Surety Bond and was placed into Middletown Female Cell #11 pending arraignment at G.A #9 on January 12th 2017 at 0900 hours. Nothing further.

REMARKS

On 1/11/2016, at approximately 1836 hours, Detective Lemieux and I were traveling northbound on Broad Street, approaching Williams Street. I observed a black Chrysler Crossfire, bearing CT registration AD26178, traveling directly in front of our unmarked police vehicle. I noticed the rear marker plate on the vehicle was not illuminated in violation of 14-96c. Detective Lemieux activated our emergency lights and siren to initiate a traffic stop. It should be noted the stop occurred within 1500' of the Traverse Square public housing project

The operator, later identified as Jiquane Collins, provided me with his license, and registration. As I was speaking with him, Collins began to reach downward into his right pant pocket. I believed that Collins could be reaching for a weapon to use against myself or Detective Lemieux. We immediately had him exit the vehicle and I patted him down for weapons. In his right front pant pocket I felt what I was immediately able to identify as a baggie containing suspected crack cocaine. I removed a plastic sandwich baggie that contained six pieces of a white soap like substance tied in plastic that I was able to identify through my training and experience as suspected crack cocaine. In his right front pant pocket I also found \$530 in US currency.

There was no additional contraband

Collins was transported to the Middletown Police Department where he was processed, fingerprinted and photographed. He was of advised of his Miranda rights in writing, but refused to make any statements.


The Chrysler was transported to the Middletown Police Department. The suspected crack cocaine tested positive for the presumptive presence of crack cocaine with NARK 13. The baggie containing the 6 bags crack cocaine weighed 1.2 grams on a department scale.

During the stop and in the station Collin's iPhone was receiving numerous calls and text messages. This is typical of an individual involved in the drug trade. As he did the messages would appear on the screen, without anyone manipulating the phone. A text message from an individual named " " said the following "I'd come grab another 40 but no way if there that small". I know through training and experience that a "40" refers to .4 grams of crack cocaine or \$40 of crack cocaine.


The amount of crack cocaine in Collins possession was more than a common user would have in their possession. Given the fact that the crack cocaine was individually packaged for sale, the amount of crack cocaine, coupled with the large sum of US currency in Collins possession with no tangible income, it was evident that he was directly involved in the sale of the drug. The street value of the crack cocaine was determined to be \$120 if sold at \$10 per .1 gram.

Collins was held on a \$150,000 surety bond. He is scheduled to appear at GA-9 in Middletown on 1/12/2016 at 0900 hours for violation of CGS 14-96c Failure to Illuminate Marker Plate, 21a-279(a)(1) Possession of Crack Cocaine, Possession of Cocaine With Intent to Sell, and 21a-278a(b) Possession With Intent to Sell in a School Zone.

REMARKS

On 01-11-2017 Detectives from the Middletown Police Department Narcotics Unit prepared to execute a signed narcotics search and seizure warrant on Curtis Keewan Jones 84 Mill St left front apartment. The tenant of 84 Mill Street left front apartment is

It should be noted that 84 Mill St is within 1500' of the St Mary's Elementary school. (see map)

This search warrant was obtained as a result of numerous complaints from local and neighboring residents, building management, landlords in the area, as well as numerous hours of surveillance of the residence conducted by the Narcotics Unit in their ongoing investigation into illegal narcotic sales occurring in Middletown. Jones is known to Detectives to sell crack cocaine from 84 Mill St front left apartment.

At approximately 2200 hours, Detectives proceeded to the area of 84 Mill St. Detectives conducted surveillance of the area and at about 2255HRS observed a vehicle we believed was being operated by Jones in the area. We watched as it pulled into the driveway and followed it. Once in the driveway I observed Jones outside of the same vehicle, walking toward the passenger side. I exited the vehicle and announced I was a police officer and told him to stop and show his hands. He complied. He was placed in handcuffs without incident.

Detective Sergeant Yepes along with detectives Dirga, Peck and Lathrop as well as officers St Peter and Smith approached the 84 Mill St to serve the search warrant on the front left apartment.

They loudly announced our presence and intent to serve a signed search and seizure warrant. After several seconds of no one answering the door, and feeling that those inside may either be hiding, attempting to destroy evidence, or attempting to retrieve weapons to use against police, we were forced to gain entry by breaching the apartment door. Once entry was made was located exiting a backroom with another male, They were detained without incident. No one else was present in the residence.

Jones was searched and found to be free of any contraband. He was in possession of a large sum of cash (counted later for a total of \$919.00). I asked him if there was anything else on his person and he said no. I asked if there was anything in his vehicle and he said no, go ahead and search it. As I stood near the front of the vehicle I could detect the odor of marijuana coming from its interior. Detective Dirga came back to my location and immediately mentioned the strong odor of marijuana in the vehicle, and began searching it.

The following items were in the vehicle being operated by Jones (CT 4AUEF9).

1. Two burned marijuana cigars (.5 grams total) that Detective Dirga found in the ashtray
2. One white plastic "Ice Cubes" chewing gum container in the center console. Inside the plastic container was 50 bags containing an off white powder I was able to recognize as heroin, 6.3 grams of an off white rock like substance I was able to recognize as crack cocaine, .7 grams of an off white rock like substance I was able to recognize as crack cocaine, 2.8 grams of a white powder substance I was able to recognize as cocaine, two bags (2.4 grams and 2.9 grams) of a green leafy substance I was able to recognize as marijuana. I was able to identify these narcotics through my training and experience as a police officer.
3. A container of razor blades commonly used to divide narcotics into smaller quantities in order to sell.
4. Four cellular telephones. Two of them are black Samsung flip phones. Two of them are black "cool pad" smart

phones.

The suspected marijuana tested positive for the presumptive presence of marijuana with a NARK 9 revealing an orange color indicating the presence of marijuana. The suspected cocaine was tested using NARK kit 13 revealing a blue color indicating the presence of cocaine. The suspected heroin was tested using NARK kit 9 revealing a yellow color indicating the presence of heroin. Detective Peck tested all of the above listed narcotics and has been trained in the use of narcotic test kits, having used them for numerous narcotic investigations in the past.

The street value of the marijuana (total approximate weight 5.3 grams) was determined to be \$106 if sold at \$20 per gram. The street value of the crack cocaine (total approximate weight 7 grams) was determined to be \$700.00 if sold at \$10 per .1 gram. The street value of the powder cocaine (total approximate weight 2.8 grams) was \$280.00 if sold at \$10 per gram. The street value of the heroin (50 total bags) was \$500.00 if sold at \$10 per bag. That coupled with the scale, packaging material, and large sums of US currency, it was evident that Jones is involved in the sale of narcotics.

The US currency and the Subaru Legacy were deemed to be the ill-gotten gains of drug sales and were seized under asset forfeiture.

Curtis Jones was charged with 21a-278(b)*+ possession of narcotics with intent to sell, 21a-278a(b) possession of narcotics within 1500' of a school, 21a-267(a) possession of drug paraphernalia, 21a-279a(1) possession of a controlled substance, 21a-279a1st possession of less than 1/2 ounce of marijuana on UAR 8873884. He was held on a \$200,000.00 surety bond and given a court date of 1-12-17 at GA-09 in Middletown. Jones was given a verbal warning for misuse of a registration marker, and operating a motor vehicle with an expired license.

A State Police Records Check indicated Jones who is a convicted felon, has past convictions for possession of narcotics (multiple convictions), possession of narcotics in a prohibited place, disorderly conduct, operating a motor vehicle with a suspended license (multiple convictions), possession of narcotics with intent to sell, assault in the third degree, violation of probation (multiple convictions), criminal impersonation, burglary in the second degree, and larceny in the sixth degree. My investigation also revealed Jones is currently on parole. His conditions state he is not to be in possession of weapons, drugs or alcohol. He is also not allowed contact with Sgt Yepes contacted Jones' parole officer () and advised her of his arrest requesting a call back in the morning.

REMARKS

On 01-11-2017 Detectives from the Middletown Police Department Narcotics Unit prepared to execute a signed narcotics search and seizure warrant on 34 Mill St left front apartment. The tenant of 84 Mill Street left front apartment is James Hall.

It should be noted that 84 Mill St is within 1500' of the St Mary's Elementary school. (see map)

This search warrant was obtained as a result of numerous complaints from local and neighboring residents, building management, landlords in the area, as well as numerous hours of surveillance of the residence conducted by the Narcotics Unit in their ongoing investigation into illegal narcotic sales occurring in Middletown. Individuals are known to Detectives to sell narcotics from 84 Mill St front left apartment.

Detective Seargent Yepes along with detectives Dirga, Peck and Lathrop as well as officers St Peter and Smith approached the 84 Mill St to serve the search warrant on the front left apartment.

They loudly announced our presence and intent to serve a signed search and seizure warrant. After several seconds of no one answering the door, and feeling that those inside may either be hiding, attempting to destroy evidence, or attempting to retrieve weapons to use against police, we were forced to gain entry by breaching the apartment door. Once entry was made Hall was located exiting a backroom with another male, they were detained without incident. No one else was present in the residence.

The following items were in the possession of an arrested party listed on the search warrant who was in the driveway of the house.

1. Two burned marijuana cigars (.5 grams total) that Detective Dirga found in the ashtray
2. One white plastic "Ice Cubes" chewing gum container in the center console. Inside the plastic container was 50 bags containing an off white powder I was able to recognize as heroin, 6.3 grams of an off white rock like substance I was able to recognize as crack cocaine, .7 grams of an off white rock like substance I was able to recognize as crack cocaine, 2.8 grams of a white powder substance I was able to recognize as cocaine, two bags (2.4 grams and 2.9 grams) of a green leafy substance I was able to recognize as marijuana. I was able to identify these narcotics through my training and experience as a police officer.
3. A container of razor blades commonly used to divide narcotics into smaller quantities in order to sell.
4. Four cellular telephones. Two of them are black Samsung flip phones. Two of them are black "cool pad" smart phones.

In the kitchen the following items were found:

5. Proof of residence for James Hall in the form of mail that I found on the kitchen table
6. Three plastic bags with corners torn off (tear bags) that Detective Lathrop found in the kitchen garbage. In my experience drug dealers commonly put narcotics such as crack cocaine into the corner of a plastic bag, tie the remaining bag in a knot and tear off the remainder.

In the main bedroom belonging to James Hall the following items were found:

7. A digital scale with white residue (tested positive for cocaine) found in the bedroom closet shelf by Det Dirga
8. A broken glass pipe with burned ends and brillo pad stuffed in one end (consistent with a crack pipe) found in a jacket pocket in the bedroom closet by Det Dirga
9. Drug paraphernalia in the form of three small pieces of plastic (bag corners commonly used to package crack cocaine) one blue waxine bag commonly used to package heroin, one plastic "Blunt splitter" and a glass pipe with burned ends consistent with a crack pipe. All of this was located in a drawer on in the TV table located by Detective Dirga.

The suspected marijuana tested positive for the presumptive presence of marijuana with a NARK 9 revealing an orange color indicating the presence of marijuana. The suspected cocaine was tested using NARK kit 13 revealing a blue color indicating the presence of cocaine. The suspected heroin was tested using NARK kit 9 revealing a yellow color indicating the presence of heroin. Detective Peck tested all of the above listed narcotics and has been trained in the use of narcotic test kits, having used them for numerous narcotic investigations in the past.

The street value of the marijuana (total approximate weight 5.3 grams) was determined to be \$106 if sold at \$20 per gram. The street value of the crack cocaine (total approximate weight 7 grams) was determined to be \$700.00 if sold at \$10 per


.1 gram. The street value of the powder cocaine (total approximate weight 2.8 grams) was \$280.00 if sold at \$10 per gram. The street value of the heroin (50 total bags) was \$500.00 if sold at \$10 per bag. That coupled with the scale, packaging material, and large sums of US currency, it was evident that is involved in the sale of narcotics.

James Hall was charged with 21a-267(a) possession of drug paraphernalia and 21a-279(a)(1) possession of narcotics on UAR 8873885 and held on a \$2500.00 surety bond. He was given a court date of 01-12-17 at GA-09 in Middletown.

A check of James Hall's history revealed he is a convicted felon with previous convictions for; Possession of Narcotics (multiple convictions), Sale of Illegal Drugs, Sale of Hallucinogen/Narcotics (multiple convictions), Disorderly Conduct, Interfering/Resisting, Probation Violation (multiple convictions), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia (multiple convictions), Failure to Appear 1st (multiple convictions), Failure to Appear 2nd (multiple convictions), Burglary 2nd, Burglary 3rd, Larceny 4th, Larceny 6th (multiple convictions), Assault 3rd, Breach of Peace, Misrepresentation of a Controlled Substance, Possession Drugs in a Prohibited Place, Criminal Impersonation, and Criminal Mischief 2nd.
