Brackett was charged with Assault 3rd degree (53a-61) and Disorderly Conduct (53a-182).


Brackett was held on a \$10,000 cash only bond pending his appearance in court at GA9 on January 17, 2016 at 0900 hours.

REMARKS

On 01/16/2017 Detectives from the Middletown Police Department Narcotics Unit prepared to execute a signed narcotics search and seizure warrant on 71 Spring St. Middletown, CT.

It should be noted that 71 Spring St. is located directly across the street from the Macdonough Elementary School, approximately 104 feet (see attached map).

This search warrant was obtained as a result of numerous complaints from local and neighboring residents, building management, landlords in the area, as well as numerous hours of surveillance of the residence conducted by the Narcotics Unit in their ongoing investigation into illegal narcotic sales occurring in Middletown.

The Narcotics Unit has received reports from all of the above mentioned sources that residents have been utilizing 71 Spring St. Middletown, CT to sell marijuana.

At approximately 0927 hours, the Middletown Police Narcotics Unit assisted by members of the Patrol Division proceeded to 71 Spring St. They loudly announced their presence and intent to serve a signed search and seizure warrant. After several seconds of no one answering the door, and feeling that those inside may either be hiding, attempting to destroy evidence, or attempting to retrieve weapons to use against police, Police were forced to gain entry by breaching the front door. A male was located in his second floor bedroom, Ricardo Hardison and a female were located in Hardison's second floor bedroom. They were all detained without incident.

I advised Hardison of the signed search warrant for the residence and asked if anything would be located in his bedroom. Hardison stated marijuana would be found both in a large plastic container in the corner of his room and in his closet.

Once the residence was secured Detectives began a thorough search of the residence. The following items were found:

In Hardison's bedroom:

A digital scale in the top dresser drawer commonly used by drug dealers to break down large amounts of illicit drugs into smaller amounts for sale, found by Det. Peck.

A plastic container with (4) individually packed baggies of suspected marijuana (each baggie contained approximately 4 grams) in a large Rubbermaid container in the N/W corner, found by Det. Peck.

A plastic container with \$120.00 US currency and (2) individually packed baggies of suspected marijuana (each baggie contained approximately 4 grams) in the closet, found by Det. Peck.

Mail addressed to Ricardo Hardison (71 Spring St.) found on Hardison's bedroom dresser by Sgt. Yepes.

A small baggie of suspected marijuana found on Hardison's bedroom dresser by Sgt. Yepes.
Numerous small baggies containing suspected marijuana residue found in the top dresser drawer found by Det. Peck.
White Samsung cell phone on chair found by Det. Peck.
Bag containing numerous new small resealable baggies found on the top shelf of Hardison's closet found by Det. Lemieux.
Paystub for Ricardo Hardison on the dresser found by Det. Lathrop.
Laptop computer on nightstand found by Det. Lemieux.

In the bedroom belonging to ARRESTED PARTY 2 (AP2) the following items were found:

A plastic baggie containing suspected crack cocaine (later weighed 6.2 grams)
Mail addressed to AP2 (71 Spring St.) found on nightstand by Det. Dirga.
An open box of unused plastic baggies on the table found by Det. Dirga.
(2) Plastic baggies with the corners torn off, commonly used by drug dealers to package narcotics for sale, in a shoe in the closet, found by Det. Dirga.
Cancelled Liberty Bank check to : on the nightstand found by Det. Dirga.

Ricardo Hardison stated that all items found in his room belonged to him and the female was unaware of the contraband. She was released from the scene. No contraband was located in the male's bedroom and he was released at the scene.

Ricardo Hardison was transported to Middletown Police Headquarters where he was advised of his rights, fingerprinted and processed. After being read his rights, Hardison then waived them and made a verbal statement to Det. Lemieux. Ricardo Hardison stated that he lost his job in October of 2016. He stated that at that time he began selling marijuana to "make ends meet."

Hardison signed a consent to search form in regards to his personal cell phone which had been seized from his bedroom. The consent form has been submitted with this case report. Upon reviewing Hardison's Samsung Galaxy Prevail cell phone I observed numerous text messages from an assortment of telephone numbers ordering marijuana. In response, Hardison regularly agrees to the sales going so far as to arrange to deliver it to different addresses and/or locations.

The (7) baggies of suspected marijuana and numerous baggies containing marijuana residue were tested by Det. Lathrop and returned a positive result for the presumptive presence THC, using NARK 9. Det. Lathrop then weighed the marijuana on a department scale for a total weight of 23.7 grams.

The street value of the marijuana, if sold at \$20 per gram, was determined to be \$474.00. The amount of marijuana found in Hardison's possession was more than a normal user would have in their possession and individually packaged for sale. That coupled with the scale and packaging material found in Hardison's room made it clear that he was directly involved in the sale of marijuana.


All items located in the residence were tagged as evidence and secured in a locker at Middletown Police Headquarters. The US Currency found in Hardison's room was seized for asset forfeiture.

Ricardo Hardison is a convicted felon with previous convictions for; Violating a Restraining Order, Violation of Conditions 2nd Degree, Unlawful Restraint 1st Degree, Breach of Peace 2nd Degree, Destroy Property, Weapon in Institution, Sale of Illegal Drugs, Sale of Hallucinogen/Narcotics (multiple convictions), Possession of Drugs/Marijuana, Illegal Sale of Controlled Drugs, Assault 3rd Degree, Illegal Possession of Controlled Substance.

Ricardo Hardison was held on a \$100,000 surety bond for violations of CGS; 21a-279(a)(1) Possession of Over ½ Ounce of Marijuana, 21a-267(a) Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, 21a-277(b) Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Sell, and 21a-279(b) Possession of Marijuana within 1500' of a School Zone. He is scheduled to appear at GA9 in

Middletown on 01/17/2017 at 0900 hours.

AP1 stated that all items found in his room belonged to him and the female was unaware of the contraband. She was released from the scene. No contraband was located in the other bedroom and the male was released at the scene.

Det. Dirga and Sgt. Yepes made contact with Ronald Davis at his work and took him into custody. Upon arriving at Middletown Police Headquarters, Davis was advised of his rights, fingerprinted and processed.

The suspected crack cocaine was tested by Det. Lathrop and returned a positive result for the presumptive presence cocaine with NARK 13. Det. Lathrop then weighed the crack cocaine on a department scale for a total weight of 6.2 grams.

The street value of the crack cocaine, if sold at \$10 per .1 gram, was determined to be \$620.00. The amount of crack cocaine found in the Davis' possession was more than a normal user would have in their possession. That coupled with the packaging material found in the Davis' room made it clear that he was directly involved in the sale of crack cocaine.

All items located in the residence were tagged as evidence and secured in a locker at Middletown Police Headquarters.

Ronald Davis is a convicted felon with previous convictions for; Possession of Narcotics (multiple convictions), Sale of Hallucinogen/Narcotics (multiple convictions), Failure to Appear 2nd Degree, Issuing a Bad Check (multiple convictions), Larceny 6th Degree (numerous convictions).

Ronald Davis was held on a \$50,000 surety bond for violations of CGS; 21a-279(a)(1) Possession of Narcotics, 21a-267(a) Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, 21a-278(a)(b) Possession of Drugs in School Zone, 21a-278(b)+ Possession of Narcotics with Intent to Sell. He is scheduled to appear at GA9 in Middletown on 01/17/2017 at 0900 hours.

On 01-13-2017 at approximately 1300 hours Detectives from the Middletown Police Department Narcotics Unit prepared to execute a signed narcotics search and seizure warrant on Luis Ramos, 562 Main Street Unit #2, and 564 Main Street (Main Street Laundry) Middletown, Connecticut 06457. The tenant's of 562 Main Street Unit #2 are Luis Ramos, his girlfriend, and a juvenile (4 year old).

This search warrant was obtained as a result of numerous complaints from local and neighboring residents, building management, landlords in the area, as well as numerous hours of surveillance conducted by the Narcotics Unit in their ongoing investigation into illegal narcotic sales occurring in Middletown. Ramos is known to Detectives to sell heroin.

At approximately 1315 hours Sgt. Yepes observed Ramos walking S/B on Main Street approaching 564 Main Street (Main Street Laundry). Detective Peck and I (Detective Lathrop) along with Ofc. Spedding secured Ramos in front of 564 Main Street. Ramos was placed in handcuffs which were double locked and checked for tightness. A search of Ramos revealed 32 bags containing an off white powdery substance suspected to be heroin in his wallet, a black flip style cell phone, one hypodermic needle, and \$96.00 in US currency. Ramos also had keys around his neck which were later used to open both his apartment and the laundry mat. While being handcuffed and searched Ramos asked what all this was about. He then told Sgt. Yepes he was just about to meet a client at the laundry mat and he was not doing anything wrong. Ramos was then placed in the rear of a marked MPD vehicle which was parked on Main Street near Ferry Street.

At approximately 1320 hours uniformed Officers and Narcotics Detectives proceeded to 562 Main Street unit #2 and 564 Main Street Middletown CT 06457. We announced our presence and intent to serve a signed search and seizure warrant on both locations. After several seconds of no one answering the door, and feeling that those inside may either be hiding, attempting to destroy evidence, or attempting to retrieve weapons to use against police, we were forced to gain entry into both locations using the keys retrieved from Ramos.

The laundry mat (564 Main Street) was unoccupied and secured by MPD detectives. A thorough search of the laundry mat by detectives and narcotics K9 revealed 5 of empty heroin bags with a green present logo on the wax paper bags and a plastic baggie with the corner torn off. In my experience drug dealers commonly put narcotics into the corner of a plastic bag, tie the remaining bag in a knot, and tear off the remainder. Once the search of the laundry mat was completed it was secured with the key by Detective Lathrop.

When making entry into the apartment (562 Main Street unit#2) detectives located Ramos's girlfriend and a juvenile/victim (4 year old) inside the residence. Both were compliant and followed instructions given while making entry. The girlfriend and the juvenile/victim were allowed to stay on the bed while detectives were conducting the search.

Once the apartment was secured Narcotics Detectives began a thorough search of the apartment. Inside the apartment detectives located the following items:

1. In the bathroom Detective Lathrop located 3 empty bags of heroin with green present logo in the garbage can next to the toilet.
2. On the microwave Detective Lemieux located one bag containing an off white powdery substance suspected to be heroin with a green present logo.

3. On the kitchen table Detective Lemieux located Proof of Residency of Ramos.

Once the search of both locations was completed Ramos and all the evidence and contraband collected was transported to MPD headquarters for processing.

Detective Peck tested the suspected heroin which was seized from Ramos using NARK kit 10003 which revealed a yellow color indicating the presence of heroin. Detective Peck has been trained in the use of narcotic test kits, having used them for numerous narcotic investigations in the past.


Detective Peck tested the one bag containing an off white powdery substance suspected to be heroin with a green present logo located on the microwave separately. This bag was also tested using NARK kit 10003 which revealed a yellow color indicating the presence of heroin.


Once back at MPD headquarters Ramos was advised of his Miranda Rights. Ramos signed the MPD Notice and Waiver of Rights form at approximately 1519 hours.

Luis Ramos was fingerprinted, photographed and processed under UAR # 8873892 in violation of CGS 21a-279(a)(1) Possession of Narcotics, 21a-278(b) Possession of Narcotics With Intent to Sell, 21a-267(a) Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and 21a-278a(b) Possession of Narcotics within 1500' of a Day Care, and 53a-21 Risk of Injury to a Minor (See attached map for the Green Street Arts Center Daycare 360.12 feet) Ramos was held on a \$150,00 surety bond awaiting his court appearance at GA-09.

A records check of Ramos revealed 8 prior arrests in New Jersey with convictions of Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Opium, Derivative, or Synthetic Narcotic, Possession of Heroin, 3rd degree drug offenses, Shoplifting, Possession with Intent, Receive Stolen Property, and Probation Violation. A records check in Connecticut revealed 2 prior arrests with convictions of Breach of Peace 2nd and Sale of a Record without ID.

DCF was notified of this case.





REMARKS

On January 14, 2017 at approximately 1717 hours I was dispatched to the area of 120 Reservoir Road for a report of female with injuries who had possibly been in a domestic incident.

Upon arrival I spoke to Victim 1. Victim 1 stated she had just been attacked by her boyfriend Thomas Michaud. Victim 1 said she had been picked up by Michaud at her house and he immediately started arguing with her about her cheating on him with someone. Victim 1 said she tried to get out of the vehicle and go back inside, but Michaud grabbed onto her jacket against her will and would not let her get out. Victim 1 said Michaud then drove off and was yelling at her the entire time. Victim 1 said Michaud threatened to hit her, and then he swing and hit her in the face. Victim 1 said she balled herself up and tried to stay as close to the door as possible so he could not hit her again. Victim 1 said Michaud turned onto Reservoir road and stated he was taking her to be jumped by a group of people. As they were approaching a stop sign, she made the decision to jump out of the vehicle to get away from Michaud.

Victim 1 said Michaud then sped away.

Victim 1 had significant visible injuries. I could see blood on her leg below her knee and several scrapes and cuts from the pavement. There was also blood on Victim 1's wrist and more cuts and scraped. Victim 1's jacket was covered in dirt which she stated came from rolling across the ground after jumping out. Victim 1 said she believed the vehicle was traveling approximately 50 miles per hour. Because of this, Hunter's Ambulance EMT's decided it would be best to send Victim 1 to Hartford Hospital. Officer St. Peter went to Hartford Hospital where Victim 1 provided him with a sworn written statement further documenting the incident.


As Victim 1 was being placed in the back of the ambulance, I noticed a man standing by the fire truck that was parked on the street. The man appeared to be looking over at the area we were located, so I decided to approach him. I asked the man how he was doing and he immediately said "she jumped out of the car for no reason". At that time I realized I was talking to Michaud. Michaud stated he had confronted Victim 1 about cheating on him and they were arguing, but claimed he had never put his hands on her. Michaud said Victim 1 had jumped out of the car because she was worried about his past. I asked him what he meant by that, and he said she must have been thinking about all of the things he had done in his past and decided to jump out of the car. Michaud said he had never grabbed on to Victim 1's jacket.

Michaud was placed under arrest and transported to Middletown Police Headquarters where he was read his rights, fingerprinted, and processed. Michaud was charged with Disorderly Conduct (53a-182) and Unlawful Restraint (53a-96).

Michaud was held on a \$25,000 surety bond pending his appearance at GA9 on January 17, 2017 at 0900 hours.

REMARKS

ASSET FORFEITURE

On 1/16/17 at approximately 1756hrs Officer Remotti and I (Officer Wasilewski) were stopped at the intersection of Rapallo Avenue and Main Street waiting for our traffic signal to turn green. As we waited a gray Nissan 350Z 2 door vehicle (bearing CT registration AA22583) traveling northbound on Main Street turned left (eastbound) onto Rapallo Avenue past our marked Police cruiser. As the vehicle traveled past I observed that it did not have a front license plate, in violation of CGS 14-18a. As the vehicle traveled eastbound on Rapallo Avenue I saw in my driver side mirror that the vehicle did not have any functioning tail lights, in violation of CGS 14-96c. We followed the vehicle and conducted a motor vehicle stop in front of

Pedal Power at 359 Main Street.

I approached the driver side of the vehicle and spoke with the operator, later identified as .


Officer Remotti approached the passenger side and spoke with the front passenger, later identified as John Ingraham. When asked for his driver's license, stated he did not have it on him. I asked him for his vehicle registration and insurance but stated it was located in a compartment behind the passenger seat where he was unable to reach. I explained to him that I would be more comfortable looking for the paperwork myself rather than have him searching the rear compartment of his vehicle. He stated I could look in the vehicle and explained that he believed it was in the compartment directly behind the passenger seat, but he was not positive. I moved the passenger seat forward and looked inside of a glove compartment type area located directly behind the passenger seat but the vehicle documents were not inside. I then looked under the passenger seat for any vehicle paperwork and found a small piece of a knotted plastic baggie. Through my training and experience as a Police Officer I know that those small baggies are commonly used to hold small amounts of cocaine or crack cocaine.

A search of person turned up negative. I then asked Officer Remotti to search Ingraham's person. Officer Remotti subsequently found two clear ziplock sandwich baggies. One of the ziplock baggies contained 27 glassine baggies which contained suspected heroin. The second ziplock baggie contained 58 of the same glassine baggies with suspected heroin inside. The 85 Baggies of suspected heroin is far more than personal use and indicative of sales. The glassine baggies were also held together with small black elastic bands into bundles of 10 baggies each. Heroin baggies are commonly sold at the street level in bundles of 10, the same way the bundles found on Ingraham were packaged. Also in Ingraham's pocket was an orange straw approximately 3" long. The straw contained a powdery substance inside. Ingraham also had a Suboxone sublingual packet in his pocket. Ingraham was placed under arrest and sat in the rear of our Police cruiser.


The 85 bags of suspected heroin found on Ingraham's person were seized and later brought to the Middletown Police Department where they were tagged as evidence. Three of the glassine baggies from each of the three separate ziplock baggies was taken out and tested with a NARK 3 heroin test kit as well as a NARK 33 Fentanyl/Heroin test kit. All three glassine baggies tested positive for the presumptive presence of heroin. They were tagged as evidence and placed in Middletown evidence locker #3.

Ingraham was transported to the Middletown Police Department where he was read his rights, photographed, fingerprinted, and processed by Officer Remotti. John Ingraham was charged with violation of CGS 21a-279(a) Possession of Narcotics and 21a-278(a) Possession of Narcotic with Intent to sell (UAR 8873902). He was assigned a next day court date of 1/17/17 at 0900hrs and told he would have to appear at the GA 9 court house on that date and time. He was held on a \$100,000 Cash/Surety bond.


Campbell was handcuffed in front for her comfort due to a recent right shoulder injury. She said that her right shoulder hurts. She said that she will seek medical attention if released.

i, who was in the apartment at the time of the altercation, stated she had heard the commotion, but did not see anything occur. Both and VICTIM stated that Alissa was acting out of


control and has a history of "blacking out" in episodes where she becomes violent.

I went to Middlesex ER where Alissa was being treated for an injury to her foot. Alissa stated she had been in an altercation with her mother and admitted it had become physical.
