## Pharmacies/Prescriptions

The CDC recommends you contact your healthcare provider to ask about obtaining extra necessary medications to have on hand during the outbreak of COVID-19 in your community. If you cannot get extra medications, consider using mail-order for medications.

CVS, Walgreens and Hancock Pharmacy are offering free delivery of prescriptions. There may be delays due to high demand. Please contact your pharmacy directly.

## Transportation—Middletown Area Transit (860) 346-0212

As of the printing of this newsletter, Middletown Area Transit service is still operational. The transit terminal has been closed until further notice, but the buses are running. Regular buses can be accessed from Court Street.

All bus passes can be purchased online at <http://www.middletownareatransit.org>. Passengers will now board from the rear door with the exception of dial-a-ride service, those who are in wheelchairs, or those that require the bus to kneel. Cash fares cannot be collected. If you do not have a pass, they will not charge a fare.

There are no changes to dial-a-ride or ADA fares or boarding. Middletown Area Transit asks that you help keep them and other safe by limiting your bus travel to only essential trips, distancing yourself from others while riding, and don't ride if you are sick.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **When are you going to reopen?**

Once the Governor relaxes some of the restrictions, the Mayor will make a determination of when the Senior Center will reopen. While none of us can predict the future, we assume that there will still be restrictions as to how many people can gather in one place and what type of gatherings will be permitted. We will utilize our automated message system to notify you of any updates. We do not anticipate running any organized programming in the month of May.

### **I need assistance getting food. Can you help?**

We have partnered with the Amazing Grace food pantry to help those that need assistance with basic grocery essentials. The need for assistance is not just purely financial. We are in the middle of a pandemic and our members are the most vulnerable to the Covid-19 virus. They have a saying: "Everyone is welcome at our table, and that means you." If you are in need, we can arrange for you to get a delivery of essential items like milk, eggs, bread, canned goods, potatoes, onions, frozen meat (when available), cheese, pasta, sauce, etc. The contents of the grocery delivery varies and is based on donations. If you don't need delivery, you can go to Amazing Grace at 16 Stack St on Wednesdays or Fridays from 11am-4pm. Please call us and leave a message at (860) 638-4540 if you need assistance with this.

The other options are to utilize an online grocery delivery service described on page 3 or you can call October Kitchen in Manchester. They offer prepared meals delivered weekly for a reasonable price. They deliver to Middletown once a week for a \$35 minimum order. (860) 533-0588 or [octoberkitchen.com](http://octoberkitchen.com)

### **Is the staff working?**

All staff members are working remotely. If you need assistance, please call (860) 638-4540 and leave a message.

### **Why are you calling us to check-in?**

We launched a "Keep Connected" outreach program at the end of March. We don't want any of our members to feel isolated. We're all struggling trying to find our new normal during this pandemic. We are all in this together! Our members are like family and that's what families do in crisis, they reach out and keep connected. If you want to be removed from the list, just let the staff person know. We've partnered with the Recreation Division and Russell Library to help us make these outbound calls.

### **Will I be credited for missed programming?**

Yes, we have credited accounts for missed paid programming.

### **Will we have the expo this year?**


No, unfortunately, we had to cancel this year's Senior Expo.

We are all doing well! We miss you so much! We can't wait to get back to a normal schedule and look forward to be able to run fun programming! Feel free to send us an email to catch up!




