Duane Barnes House "The Stone Cottage" 327 High Street, Middletown, Ct. 06457

A south wing was added, probably around 1855, and is very close stylistically to the priginal structure. When Wesleyan converted the house to infirmary use in 1936, a two story wing was added to the south. This wing was expanded in 1970. The interior was altered drastically in 1936 to accommodate patient care requirements; however, some details such as fireplaces and woodwork remain.

The romantic naturalism and picturesque architecture advocated by A.J. Downing became popular primarily with America's intellectual avant-garde of which Duane Barnes was a characteristic member. The high style architecture of this house maintained the opulent tradition of 19th century High Street as Middletown's most prestigious residential area; however, its unique qualities are distinctly a reflection of Duane Barnes's individual taste.
