**REMARKS**

On 01-08-2021 at approximately 1000 hours Detectives from the Middletown Police Department Street Crime Unit prepared to execute a signed search and seizure warrant on Daniel Kiczuk and his residence, 87 Bailey Rd, Middletown, CT 06457. The other resident of 87 Bailey Rd is [redacted] mother. This search warrant was obtained after numerous complaints from a neighbor, a garbage pull resulting in the recovery of evidence consistent with marijuana trafficking and surveillance conducted at the residence.

At approximately 1030 hours Sgt Yepes observed Daniel Kiczuk exit 87 Bailey Rd carrying a duffel bag and a plastic shopping type bag. Kiczuk entered the vehicle he is known to operate bearing CT registration [redacted] a 2005 Nissan Sentra color gray. Kiczuk left his home and proceeded east on Westfield St where Detectives Peck and Lathrop conducted a motor vehicle stop. Kiczuk was detained in handcuffs and searched with negative results.

Detective Peck verbally advised Kiczuk of his Miranda rights which Kiczuk stated he understood. Peck further told Kiczuk we had a search warrant for him and his residence. Peck asked Kiczuk if there was anything illegal at his house or in his car and Kiczuk said no. Kiczuk then changed his answer and said there was about three ounces of marijuana at his house, in the garage near his car. Kiczuk got extremely nervous and asked if someone told on him. I asked what Kiczuk what someone would tell on him for and he said, "like if they got pulled over". I again asked why someone would tell on him if they got pulled over by the police and he said something to the effect of, 'like if I sold to them'. I explained we would go through everything at the police department. Kiczuk was then seated in the rear of OFC Sinclair's patrol car and transported back to his residence.

When Detectives arrived at Bailey Rd we went to the front door where Sgt Yepes knocked and was met by [redacted] Sgt Yepes explained the situation and [redacted] welcomed us into the residence. I provided her with a copy of the search warrant at that time. A search of the residence revealed no other occupants. Once Detectives were sure there were no other people present, we began a search for narcotics and other contraband. While searching Detective located;

1. Six bags of marijuana (total 144 grams / 5.07945 ounces) on garage shelf located by Detective Lemieux
  - 'platinum purple kush' 13.7 grams
  - 'runtz' 62.5 grams
  - 'god's gift' 50.4 grams
  - 'platinum purple kush' 6 grams
  - 'white runtz' 5.8 grams
  - unlabeled bag of "shake" 5.6 grams
2. Two (open) boxes of clear plastic bags on garage shelf located by Detective Lemieux
3. Clear bag containing marijuana residue on garage shelf located by Detective Lemieux
4. Ripped portion of a heat sealed bag on garage shelf located by Detective Lemieux
5. Black digital scale with marijuana residue
6. Small paper labels with marijuana strains written on them on garage shelf located by Detective Lemieux

7. Video of the area prior to the search by Det Lemieux

The total of 5.07 ounces of marijuana is more marijuana than a typical user would have in their possession and is more typical of someone selling marijuana. It is typical, based on my training and experience for those who sell marijuana to have more than one strain or type of marijuana in their possession in order to satisfy need needs of their customers. Digital scales are often used by those who sell marijuana as they normally buy the marijuana in bulk quantities and break that down into smaller amounts in order to increase their profit margins.

Clear plastic bags, such as the ones located in the same area as the larger bags of marijuana are often used to re-package bulk marijuana. There were two types of unused clear plastic bags recovered. It should be noted that one of the types was located in Kiczuk's trash during the trash pull and those recovered bags (from the trash pull) contained marijuana residue. The second type of bag recovered is the same type of clear plastic bag that was in the possession of a party (MPD case # 21-00050) who we stopped after making a suspected hand to hand narcotics transaction with Kiczuk at his residence.

**In Kiczuk's bedroom;**

8. \$136 US Currency found by Det Schreiner in the dresser
9. Edible gummies containing THC by Det Schreiner on the dresser
10. Mail addressed to Daniel Kiczuk at 87 Bailey Rd by Det Schriener on the dresser
11. People's United Bank statement showing a balance of \$24,374.81 on November 16, 2020 by Det Schriener on the dresser
12. Video of the area taken by Det Schreiner prior to search.

Based on the investigation and the evidence located at 87 Bailey Rd, Daniel Kiczuk was transported to the Middletown Police Department for processing by OFC Sinclair. At the Police Department Kiczuk was charged with 21a-279(a)(1) possession of marijuana over 4 ounces, 21a-277(b) possession of marijuana with intent to sell, 21a-278a(b) possession of narcotics with intent to sell in a prohibited place, 21a-267(a) possession of drug paraphernalia, 21a-279(b) possession of narcotics in a prohibited place on UAR 8878181. Kiczuk was given a court date of 04-23-2021 at GA-09 in Middletown and released on a \$150,000 non-surety bond.

A Check and check for Kiczuk revealed no prior convictions. Kiczuk's showed assault and battery charges (family) in Massachusetts.

During processing Kiczuk signed a consent to search for his phone. Sgt Yepes began to examine the contents of the phone and observed numerous drug related messages indicating that Kiczuk was selling marijuana. When Sgt Yepes opened Kiczuk's 'Cash App' he observed numerous deposits for various amounts from numerous people. It is common for those who sell narcotics to receive payments through cash app based on my training and experience.

The marijuana was transported to the Middletown Police Department where it was weighed and tested by Detective Peck. The total weight of the marijuana was 5.07945 grams. It was tested using NARK Kit 2005 showing a positive result for THC. The total street value of the marijuana if sold at \$10 / gram would be \$1,440.00. It should be noted Kiczuk does not have a medical marijuana card and has no prescription history regarding medical marijuana purchases.

## REMARKS

On 1/8/2021 at 2105 hours, Middletown Police responded to the rear loading dock area of Stop and Sop Supermarket located at 416 East Main Street on the report of a disturbance, which turned out to be a physical confrontation. Stop & Shop manager [redacted] said that his employee [redacted] was involved. Two white male suspects allegedly were attempting to steal items and fled in a dark colored Chevrolet long bed pickup truck with a partial Connecticut registration marker plate "773 or 778".

Upon arrival, I made contact with [redacted] and [redacted] black hat was lying in the parking lot where the physical altercation took place and he was holding his broken eye glasses. [redacted] stated that he was uninjured from the altercation. [redacted] refused medical attention at the scene.

[redacted] described the two white males, Suspect #1 was a white male in his early thirties white brown hair about 5'10" tall approximately two hundred (200) pounds. Suspect #1 was wearing tan colored pants with a grey short sleeve T-Shirt bearing the words "Carhart" and a red and white knit cap. Suspect #2 was described as a white male with a dark colored (possibly black) jacket with a hood and dark pants.

yelled to the white males to leave the area and that they were not allowed to be in the rear loading dock area. The two white males ignored him continuing their activity and told him "fuck off you don't own this dock". again yelled at them to leave and then stated that he was going to take a photograph of their registration marker plate to provide to Police.

approached the rear of the Chevrolet Silverado he was charged by Suspect #1 who shoved him to the ground and defended himself from Suspect #1. s black hat and eye glasses were knocked off his face and stepped on by Suspect #1. 's eye glasses were broken. requested arrest and restitution for his broken eyeglasses. The eye glasses have a total value of \$782.00.

The two male suspects fled the scene in their pickup truck. r obtained a partial plate of display (A\*77377) or (A\*77877) in a photograph.

A Stop and Shop security surveillance footage shows suspect vehicle to be a crew cab, blue or black Chevrolet Silverado or GMC Sierra pickup truck. I also was able to see Suspect #1 and Suspect #2 each climb onto the loading dock adjacent to where Dorkner was working.

showed that registration belonged on a blue 2015 GMC Sierra K1500 crew cab. The GMC was registered to Cody Caron with an address of 97 Bretton Road Manchester, CT. A secondary query of this registration was conducted via and yielded the same results.

Manchester Police Department assisted in making initial contact with Caron. I received a phone call from Caron. I asked Caron if he owned a Blue GMC Sierra pickup truck and if he was at the Stop and Shop in Middletown earlier in the evening. Caron was forthcoming and stated he did own the pickup truck bearing Connecticut registration marker plate and had been at Stop and Shop in Middletown earlier in the evening. Caron stated he was collecting wooden pallets for a bonfire he was attending. I asked Caron what he was wearing and he described the exact clothing for Suspect #1.

I asked Caron if he had left a cooler with the words "Corona" written on it behind the Stop and Shop and he stated he had. Caron stated the other person with him is his half-brother Caron agreed to respond to Middletown Police Headquarters, and arrived shortly after to retrieve his cooler and accept his misdemeanor summons. Caron's pants had a small tear in them but he was uninjured.

Sergeant Smith accompanied me into the lobby, where I met with Caron. Caron was still wearing the tan pants and red and white knit cap. Caron apologized for his involvement in the events that occurred behind Stop and Shop.

Caron was issued misdemeanor summons and complaint # (MC808451) for violation of C.G.S. 53a-181 Breach of Peace and 53a-116 Criminal Mischief in the 2nd Degree. Caron was released with a promise to appear and is due to appear at Middlesex Superior Court on 4/15/2021 at 0900 hours, to answer to the above charges.

This case is closed by arrest.

### REMARKS

On 12-11-2020 Sgt Yepes set up in the area of Main St and Washington St to conduct surveillance for narcotics activity. This is considered a high crime area known for narcotics use and sale, assaults,

prostitution and other quality of life issues. The Narcotics Unit has made numerous narcotics related arrests after observing activity consistent with narcotics activity in the past. Additionally, the Narcotics Unit continually receives information regarding individuals using 460 Main St to sell narcotics.

Sgt Yepes observed a vehicle bearing AR12614 park nearby 460 Main St. A black male who will be identified as "arrested party 2" (AP2) exited the passenger side of the vehicle and proceeded to the side entrance of 460 Main St where he was let into the building. It should be noted this door is typically locked from the inside. After a brief moment, AP 2 re-emerged and went back to the vehicle he exited.

A brief investigation revealed the registration of the vehicle was suspended due to lack of insurance.

When the vehicle left the area Detective Peck and I followed it briefly before conducting a motor vehicle stop. Believing the occupant just purchased narcotics, Detective Peck had the operator (who was identified as Edgar Chrystal) step out of the vehicle. When Chrystal stepped out a glass pipe with burned ends fell out of his sleeve. Peck was able to identify this object as a crack pipe. Peck asked Chrystal if there was any crack in the vehicle and Chrystal admitted there was, and directed Peck to look in the driver side sun visor where Peck located a small amount of suspected crack cocaine.

Edgar Chrystal was issued MSC # MC540572 for 14-215 operating a motor vehicle with suspended registration, 21a-279(a)(1) possession of a controlled substance, and 21a-267 possession of drug paraphernalia. He was issued a court date of 4-19-2021 at GA-09 in Middletown and released from the scene.

A check of Chrystal's revealed convictions for 53a-183b interfering with an emergency call (2 counts), 53a-61 assault 3rd (3 counts), 53a-64cc strangulation, 53a-123 larceny 2, 53a-125 larceny 4 (3 counts), 21a-279(a) possession of narcotics, 51a-279(c) possession of drug paraphernalia, 53a-135 robbery 2 (53a-136a enhanced penalty), 53a-92 kidnapping 1, 53a-95 unlawfull restraint, 53a-103 burglary 3 (8 counts), 53a-107 criminal trespass 1 (4 counts), and 53a-32 violation of probation (3 counts).

The suspected cocaine was transported to the Middletown Police Department where it was weighed and tested by Detective Lemieux. The suspected cocaine was tested using NARK kit # 4 showing a positive result for cocaine. The weight of the cocaine in possession of Chrystal was .3 grams.

All of the evidence was tagged and submitted to an evidence locker.



### REMARKS

The Middletown Police Department Narcotics Unit continually receives information regarding illegal drug activity from reliable confidential informants, informants, arrested persons, concerned citizens, anonymous callers and brother police officers. Over the past several months, the Narcotics Unit has received multiple reports from the above mentioned sources that there has been a large amount of narcotics activity in the area of 460 Washington Street.

On the night of 12/11/2020, Sgt. Yepes was conducting surveillance in the area. He observed a small, white, pick up truck, park in the area and white male enter the building at 460 Main Street. Exited the building after a very short time and got back into the white truck and left. Through Sgt. Yepes' training and experience as a narcotics detective, he suspected that the operator of the truck had been involved in a narcotics transaction inside the building.

The vehicle came through a parking lot between Washington Street and Court Street. I was on Court Street and pulled

behind the vehicle in my unmarked, undercover police vehicle, as it turned south on DeKoven Street. I could see that the vehicle did not have an properly functioning right rear taillight/brake light.

The vehicle turned onto MLK Blvd and continued onto William Street. Due to the suspected narcotics activity and the motor vehicle violation, I activated my vehicle's emergency lights and siren and stopped the vehicle on William Street, near Broad Street. The registration on the vehicle was CT

I approached the driver and lone occupant of the vehicle. I asked the driver for his license, registration, and proof of insurance. The driver was identified by his CT drivers license as William Marchinkoski. I asked Marchinkoski where he had just come from and he said coming from 1 Labella Circle. Marchinkoski made no mention of being at 460 Main Street, where he had just been. I had Marchinkoski step out of the vehicle, which he did, without protest. I had him step to the rear of the vehicle and asked him if there was anything illegal on his person or in the truck. Marchinkoski admitted that there was a "stem," a glass pipe used for smoking crack cocaine, in the glove compartment. Marchinkoski was placed in handcuffs as I went to retrieve the pipe from the glove compartment. After I found it, I informed Marchinkoski he was under arrest and he admitted to Detective Peck that he had "dope," meaning heroin or fentanyl, in his wallet. Detective Peck then went into Marchinkoski wallet and recovered several wax paper folds that contained a powdery substance suspected to be heroin or fentanyl.

The suspected heroin/fentanyl was tested using NARK kit 33 and returned a positive result for fentanyl. There were a total of 8 wax paper folds. The glass smoking pipe was seized, along with the fentanyl, the fentanyl was tagged as evidence and the pipe was seized for destruction.

Marchinkoski was issued a misdemeanor summons (MC455265), issued a court date of 4/19/2021, and released on scene. He was charged with the following:



### REMARKS

On 12-11-2020 Sgt Yepes set up in the area of Main St and Washington St to conduct surveillance for narcotics activity. This is considered a high crime area known for narcotics use and sale, assaults, prostitution and other quality of life issues. The Narcotics Unit has made numerous narcotics related arrests after observing activity consistent with narcotics activity in the past. Additionally, the Narcotics Unit continually receives information regarding individuals using 460 Main St to sell narcotics.

Sgt Yepes observed a vehicle bearing . park nearby 460 Main St. A black male who was later identified as Dwayne Knight exited the passenger side of the vehicle and proceeded to the side entrance of 460 Main St where he was let into the building. It should be noted this door is typically locked from the inside. After a brief moment, Knight re-emerged and went back to the vehicle he exited.

Sgt Yepes relayed this information to Detectives Peck Schreiner and myself (Det Lemieux) who checked the license plate through dispatch, which revealed it the registration was suspended due to lack of insurance.

When the vehicle left the area Detective Peck and I followed it briefly before conducting a motor vehicle stop at the intersection of Broad St and Church St. Upon stopping the vehicle Detective Peck and I

approached it. Believing the occupants just purchased narcotics, Detective Peck had the operator (who was identified arrested party 1 or AP1) step out of the vehicle. When AP1 stepped out a glass pipe with burned ends fell out of his sleeve. Peck was able to identify this object as a crack pipe. Peck asked AP1 if there was any crack in the vehicle and AP1 admitted there was, and directed Peck to look in the driver side sun visor where Peck located a small amount of suspected crack cocaine. At this point I already had Knight step out of the car.

Based on Sgt Yepes' observations of the passenger actually going to the door of 460 Main St and the discovery of the crack pipe and the crack cocaine, I began to search Knight. In the a small pocket of his jeans on his right side I located a small plastic bag containing crack cocaine. There was no other contraband on his person. Detectives Schreiner and Peck searched the vehicle with negative results.


Dwyane Knight was issued MSC # MC455264 for 21a-279(a)(1) possession of a controlled substance. He was issued a court date of 4-19-2021 at GA-09 in Middletown and released from the scene.

A check of Knight's SPRC revealed prior convictions for 53a-60 assault 2, 53a-32 violation of probation (4 counts), 21a-279(a) possession of narcotics (8 counts), 53a-124 larceny 3, 21a-268 misrepresentation of a controlled substance, 21a-279(c) possession of drugs/marijuana (3 counts), 53a-172 failure to appear 1.

The suspected cocaine was transported to the Middletown Police Department where it was weighed and tested by Detective Lemieux. The suspected cocaine was tested using NARK kit # 4 showing a positive result for cocaine. The weight of the cocaine in possession of Knight was .3 grams.

All of the evidence was tagged and submitted to an evidence locker.

### REMARKS

On Sunday, January 10, 2021 at approximately 16:11 hrs Middletown Dispatch received a report that a black Honda bearing CT reg was driving erratically in the vicinity of Peck Rd and Fowler Ave. The caller described the operator as a white female, dark hair and glasses.

Shortly after Middletown Dispatch received another report that a dark Honda Civic with a flat tire drove up on to the lawn in a yard near 23 Warner Ave. According to the caller, the operator and sole occupant of the vehicle, appeared to be intoxicated and was slurring her words. He described the female as a white

female, long dark hair and possibly wearing a black jacket.

I, Ofc. Zadjura was assigned to investigate the complaint and had arrived on-scene a short time later along with Ofc. Jeffries. Upon our arrival we located a black Honda Civic bearing CT Reg [redacted] parked in the yard along the garage of 11 Warner Ave. The vehicle was occupied by a white female with dark hair, wearing a black jacket and had sun glasses on top of her head. This female was identified as Laura Manka (DOB: 1/8/1970) by her CT-OP.

Manka advised she had pulled in to the yard as she was attempting to get home. Manka was slurring her speech heavily and could not focus on simple commands and requests given by officers. Her pupils were pin point which is indicative of possible recent narcotic use.


She advised she was not injured, and was not suffering from any medical conditions. Once on her feet she was unstable and had almost fallen over several times.


Manka refused to participate in the Standardized Field Sobriety tests. She was advised she was being placed under arrest for Driving Under The Influence of Drugs and or Alcohol, based on my initial and interviewing observations. While on-scene, a search incident to arrest was conducted on the vehicle she had occupied.

During the search Ofc. Jeffries located a vitamin pill bottle which contained copper wire mesh, which some of was burned. This item is commonly used as a filter to smoke crack/cocaine. additionally, Ofc. Jeffries located the (3) hollow glass stems, which were burned and contained a black/burnt residue and burned copper mesh in one end. These items are commonly used to ingest crack/cocaine by smoking. One was located on the front passenger floor, the other was located in an empty cigarette pack in the center console and the final was located in a black backpack which was located on the driver seat of the vehicle.

Manka, was processed and charged with the violations of CGS 14-227a - Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol or Drugs, 14-236 - Failure to Maintain Proper Lane and 21a-267 - Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. She was released from custody in lieu of a \$500 non-surety bond and is scheduled to appear at GA-09 on Friday, April 2, 2021 no later than 09:00hrs.

**REMARKS**

On 1/12/2021 at 2035hrs, I Ofc. Sanford, responded to ADDRESS for a reported domestic. Officers arrived on scene and met with Hannah Filip who stated VICTIM had thrown her on the ground and kicked her. I asked Filip what had led to the altercation, and Filip stated that VICTIM had been using a THC vape pen and became aggressive as a result. Filip stated VICTIM had also thrown items around the apartment, including breaking a glass that was in the sink.

Filip stated she was uninjured and although she claimed VICTIM had held her down and kicked her, had no marks/bruises/redness anywhere visible on her body. Filip's story had many inconsistencies and she could not answer questions about how the argument arose.

Sergeant Dirga was able to locate VICTIM in his truck across the street. When asked about the incident, VICTIM stated he had video of the entire altercation.

Sergeant Dirga observed the video, which I viewed as well. In the video, it clearly shows Filip striking VICTIM as she yells at him to pay her rent. Filip then throws a glass at VICTIM, which she eventually picks up and smashes in the kitchen.

Throughout the entire video, VICTIM attempts to avoid Filip and she continuously comes at him, repeatedly striking him. At no point did VICTIM place his hands on Filip or act in an aggressive manner.

VICTIM provided a sworn written statement that explains he had come home from work and found Filip intoxicated. When VICTIM poured out two bottles of vodka he found, Filip became aggressive with him, throwing items and hitting him.

VICTIM left the apartment shortly before police located him. VICTIM stated he was uninjured during the incident.

Officers returned to speak with Filip and explained that we had viewed VICTIM's cell phone video. Filip attempted to change her story and claim that the incident she reported had occurred previous to VICTIM's recording. With VICTIM's recording, it was determined that Filip's original reporting of the incident was completely fabricated.


Filip was issued MSC# MC732621 for violating statutes 53a-182 - Disorderly Conduct and 53a-167a - Interfering.

Filip has a court date of 1/13/2021 at 0900hrs at Middletown Superior Court.


A conditions of release form was completed, as well as a LAP screen, although VICTIM declined to speak with an advocate.
