On 02-23-2021 Sgt Yepes was conducting surveillance on Main St for narcotics activity. The area of Main St between Ferry St and Rapallo Ave would be considered a high crime area based on re-occurring instances of gang activity, assaults, narcotics use and sales, public drunkenness, prostitution and other quality of life issues. Sgt Yepes observed two males make contact with a male he was able to identify as _____ in the rear of a group of buildings, in a parking lot. Sgt Yepes observed _____ exit the second floor apartments of 59 Rapallo Ave prior to meeting with the males. Once in the parking lot with the males, _____ handed them each something small, and in return each man handed _____ an amount of money.

Believing he just witnessed a narcotics transaction, based on _____ history of selling narcotics, the high crime area and the observed behavior, Sgt Yepes relayed this information to Detectives Peck, Schreiner and I (Detective Lemieux) and Yepes maintained visual surveillance on one of the males who was later identified as Reginald Moody. Moody got into a light colored SUV and Detectives followed Moody away from the area. Detective Peck and I were directly behind Moody as he drove west on Grand St. When he reached the intersection on Grand St and High St, Moody failed to make a complete stop at the clearly posted stop sign, proceeding west on Grand St. Detective Peck and I conducted a motor vehicle stop. As we approached the vehicle I observed Moody exit without being told to do so and turn toward Detective Peck.

Detective Peck and Schreiner escorted Moody to the side walk and Peck observed Moody digging around in his pockets, even though Moody had already provided all requested documents to Peck. Peck asked Moody numerous times to stop going in his pockets and Moody acknowledged him and said

he would stop, but continued to do so. This cause Peck to attempt to handcuff Moody behind his back while he was being detained. While doing so, Peck observed Moody clenching his left hand. Peck told Moody to open his hand which revealed a clear plastic bag containing a white rock like substance he was able to identify as crack cocaine. A further search of Moody revealed no further contraband. A search of the vehicle revealed a crack pipe between the driver seat and center console. A further investigation revealed Moody had numerous warrants for his arrest.

Moody was transported to the Middletown Police Department for processing. At the police department, Moody was charged with 21a-279(a)(1) possession of a controlled substance and 21a-267 possession of drug paraphernalia on UAR 8878268. Dispatch contacted the Waterbury Police Department and confirmed the arrest warrant. Waterbury advised they would take custody of Moody and process him for both their warrant and the _____ warrants. Moody was given a court date of 05-03-2021 at GA-09 in Middletown and eventually turned over to Waterbury

On Monday 03/01/2021, Detectives from the Middletown Police Department Narcotics Unit prepared to execute a signed narcotics search and seizure warrant on Joseph Gumbs and his black 2019 Jeep Cherokee bearing CT Registration BA73716. A check of DMV records revealed Joseph Gumbs is the registered owner of a black Jeep Cherokee Latitude, bearing CT Registration BA73716 associated with an address of 494 East Main Street, Bridgeport, CT. Detective Lathrop conducted surveillance on the residence in Bridgeport on several occasions and observed the black Jeep Cherokee Latitude, bearing CT Registration BA73716 to be parked in the designated lot for the home during the overnight hours on numerous occasions.

This search warrant was obtained as a result of numerous complaints from local and neighboring residents, landlords in the area, controlled narcotics purchases, as well as numerous hours of surveillance of the area conducted by the Middletown Police Narcotics Unit in their ongoing investigation into illegal narcotic sales occurring in Middletown.

The Narcotics Unit has received reports from all of the above mentioned sources that Gumbs arrived in the area, almost daily, and parks his black Jeep SUV in the area of 30 Liberty Street. Gumbs was then regularly observed conducting hand to hand transactions in the area of Main St. and Liberty St. During the month of February, Detective Schreiner and I, Detective Peck, were conducting surveillance in the area of 494 East Main Street Bridgeport, CT. During the morning hours Detectives observed Gumbs as the sole occupant of his black Jeep Cherokee Latitude, bearing CT Registration BA73716, exit the driveway and

proceed directly to Middletown, CT, without stopping or meeting anyone. Detectives followed Gumbs from his residence, directly to Liberty Street, Middletown, CT and observed as he parked in the area of 30 Liberty Street. Detective Schreiner observed Gumbs exit his vehicle and proceed to the area of Main Street and Liberty Street on foot. Detective Schreiner maintained visual surveillance on Gumbs while I conducted a controlled narcotics purchase.

On 03/01/2021 at approximately 0815 hrs, Sergeant Yepes observed Gumbs walking S/B on Main St. approaching Liberty St. Detectives immediately made contact with Gumbs and detained him. He was advised of the search warrants and given his Miranda rights on scene. After acknowledging his rights, Gumbs admitted to having drugs on his person and in his vehicle.

A thorough search of his person revealed; several plastic baggies in his outer coat pockets. Two of the baggies contained numerous smaller baggies of an off-white rock-like substance suspected to be crack cocaine. One of the baggies contained numerous wax paper bags containing a powder substance suspected to be fentanyl, and several smaller clear bags containing a white powder suspected to be cocaine, numerous bags of a green leafy material suspected to be marijuana, 2 cell phones (a flip phone and a smart phone) and \$130.00 US currency.

A thorough search of his black Jeep Cherokee Latitude, bearing CT Registration _____, revealed; numerous baggies inside a red backpack on the rear seat. One of the bags contained 33 prescription Suboxone strips, two of the baggies contained numerous smaller baggies of an off-white rock-like substance suspected to be crack cocaine. One of the baggies contained numerous wax paper bags containing a powder substance suspected to be fentanyl, two large mason jars containing a green leafy material suspected to be marijuana, and \$1420.00 US currency.

Gumbs was advised that he was under arrest and transported to Middletown Police Headquarters to be booked and processed.

All items, including the 2019 Jeep Cherokee, were seized and subsequently transported to Middletown Police Headquarters to be tested and weighed. Upon arrival at Headquarters, Detective Peck tested and weighed all suspected evidence. The suspected crack cocaine tested positive, using NARK 13, it was determined to be a total of 130 individually packaged bags with a total weight of 32 grams. The suspected cocaine tested positive, using NARK 04, it was determined to be a total of 5 individually packaged bags with a total weight of 1 gram. The suspected fentanyl tested positive, using NARK 33, it was determined to be a total of 145 individually packaged bags. The suspected marijuana tested positive, using NARK 2005, it was determined to be a total of 68 individually packaged bags with a total weight of 99.9 grams.

The street value of the crack was determined to be \$2500.00 if sold at \$10/.1 gram. The street value of

the cocaine was determined to be \$100.00 if sold at \$10/.1 gram. The street value of the fentanyl was determined to be \$1450.00 if sold at \$10/bag. The street value of the marijuana was determined to be \$960.00 if sold at \$30/ gram. The street value of the Suboxone was determined to be \$330.00 if sold at \$10/dose.

All items listed above were tagged as evidence and secured in a locker at Middletown Police Headquarters. Through our investigation it was determined that Gumbs was conducting narcotics sale, utilizing his cell phone. It was also seized and secured as evidence. I intend to apply for a search warrant for the phone.

Based on our investigation, Sergeant Yepes contacted Bridgeport Police Task Force and advised them of the situation. It was determined that BPD would make contact with any person at the residence and secure the apartment while a search warrant was being applied for. At approximately 1030 BPD Detectives advised that they had made contact with Deborah Gumbs, Joseph's wife, who was home with her 5 children. Deborah Gumbs consented to a search of the apartment. Middletown Detective immediately responded to the scene.

Upon conducting a thorough search of the master bedroom area, Detectives located;

A glass mason jar containing a green leafy plant like substance suspected to be marijuana which later tested positive for marijuana and weighed 59 grams.

A clear plastic bag containing an off-white powder substance suspected to be heroin which later tested positive for both heroin and fentanyl and weighed 53 grams.

3 plastic baggies containing a large amount of off-white rock-like substance suspected to be crack cocaine and 2 zip-lock style bags containing 112 pieces of the same substance which later tested positive for cocaine and weighed 89.4 grams.

2 clear baggies containing 180 blue colored wax paper folds which held a tan powdered substance suspected to be heroin which later tested positive for heroin.

3 bars of "Mannite Cicogna" cut which is known to be used a cutting agent to dilute cocaine.

A black Sentry safe containing \$10,524.00 US currency, a loaded black Colt Cobra .38 special revolver, and Joseph Gumbs passport.

Large amounts of live ammunition

3 high capacity rifle magazines

A digital scale

Large amounts of narcotics packaging material
